Exactly two weeks later, on May 4, 1924, the Sisters opened the doors of the Vincentian Home for the Incurables to 24 sick and elderly women who had nowhere else to turn. As we look inward toward Lent's call for sacrifice and outward toward Easter's promise of renewal, we reflect to consider the similarities between 1924 and today.

Vincentian was founded thanks to the heroic compassion and selfless sacrifices of those who refused to stand by while others suffered. The Sisters, benefactors, and community members who made Vincentian's beginnings possible did so not by talking about compassionate service to those in need but by putting words – and dollars - into action. Today, Vincentian's mission still depends on that same fearless compassion—and on people like you.
